Shoot governed by ATA and CWTA rules.

ATA rules require eye/ear protection on the field and prohibit the consumption and use of alcohol or drugs by participants prior to or while shooting (including shoot offs).

Shooting Times – 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM 50 Targets – 25 16 yard & 25 handicap targets Minimum yardage – 20 yds (Ladies & Juniors 19 yds)

Longest known registered (ATA/PITA) or CWTA yardage must be shot. It is the responsibility of the shooter to ensure he/she is listed and shooting the proper yardage.

Punches: CWTA punches may not be reduced for two years.

50 Straight 2 yds High Score (if other than 50) 1 yd Second highest score ½ yd

Reductions: 1 yard per season max. Shooters must have participated in the previous CWTA season, to be eligible for a reduction. Shooters receiving CWTA punches in the current or previous season (2018/2019), or having greater registered yardage are not eligible for reductions. Inactive registered shooters (min 2 years) are eligible after shooting at least one CWTA season. Shooters wishing to receive a reduction must apply for it prior to shooting their first CWTA targets of the season or it will not be granted.

Buckles awarded for Champion, Lady, Junior, and Vet at each shoot – ties will shoot off.

High Overall Buckles:

All 7 shoots will be used for HOA averages.
Only the first event shot for the day qualifies for HOA.
Ties will be shot off at the Championship shoot.
Buckles for Champion, Lady, Junior, and Vet

Fees:

\$18.00 – 50 Targets Disbursements:

> \$9.00 to host club \$2.00 to CWTA

> > \$4.00 to Lewis Purse – 3 classes, CWTA system \$3.00 to Final Championship Shoot

Shooters may shoot as many times as desired, however, they must complete any unfinished rounds prior to signing up for subsequent rounds.

\$5.00 reduction in fee on first round for Juniors. Must be under 18 on date of first shoot and may remain a Junior for the entire season and compete for HOA buckle.

Options: (All ties Divide)

\$1.00 - CWTA 50 straight (pays 75% of perpetual purse)

\$3.00 – 16 Yard (pays 2 places 60/40) \$3.00 – Handicap (pays 2 places 60/40) \$2.00 – High Gun (pays 3 scores 50/30/20)

\$2.00 - Long Run from Front and Long Run from Back

\$3.00 – Junior Purse (pays top 2 scores 60/40) \$3.00 – Lady Purse (pays top 2 scores 60/40)

\$3.00 – Vet Purse (pays top 2 scores 60/40)

\$3.00 - Yardage Purse (pays top 2 scores 60/40 in each of 3 groups)

Category Declaration:

Juniors, Ladies and Vets must declare a single category prior to shooting their first targets of the CWTA season. This declaration remains in effect for the entire season and cannot be changed.

Qualification for Championship Shoot:

Shooters must shoot a minimum of 4 rounds at a minimum of 2 different clubs. Championship shoot is limited to two rounds, both qualify for all daily and added money as well as trophies.

If a shooter shoots multiple high scores, they are only qualified to participate in the trophy shoot one time.
